Current Process

- General membership reviews HUD guidance and recommends any relevant changes to policies required which are approved by Managing Board (see Attachment D)
 - Many of these are required HUD policies Managing Board affirms
- HSN creates an application process to identify the best agencies to provide the agreed upon portfolio
 - Agencies compete against other applicants providing the same project type/location/# of slots/units

- Projects that are site based (would have to be PSH for chronically homeless persons)
- Other?



Scattered Site

- Benefits all 3 counties
- Could be used to expand RRH for families, youth and victims of domestic violence
- Could be used to expand Permanent Supportive Housing for persons experiencing chronic homelessness
- Requires willing landlords

Site-Based

- Would primarily benefit the county in which is it located
- Could only be used to expand Permanent Supportive Housing for persons experiencing chronic homelessness
- Property/Landlord is already known
- Could require a successful applicant to meet specific needs
 - Target sub-population
 - Types of services
 - Layout of building(s)
