

### Conference Calls with Providers



#### Started March 8



Initially 3x/week, now 2x/week



Builds on previous collaboration during hurricanes



Provides a platform to facilitate system level response



Provider quote "I'm on a lot of conference calls every week, but this is the most valuable to me, the one that has the most information that's helpful for me."



### Weekly Situation Report, April 17

- 2 tested positive
- 2 under investigation
- ▲ 888 persons in shelters
- 3 in isolation/recovery shelter
- Roughly 70 campsites, estimated 407 persons



## CDC & HUD Guidance

Shelters keep guests 24/7

Taking temperature of guests and staff daily

Create barriers when possible

Don't disrupt campsites

Also complying with Governor's order re: employees age and underlying health conditions



## Isolation & Recovery Centers/Shelters

Private rooms for isolation when a homeless person has tested positive for COVID, is awaiting test results, or is symptomatic but does not need hospitalization or other levels of medical care

Orange Co's first guests were April 10

- Hotel being paid for by Orange County
- Operations managed by HSN, with support from City of Orlando staff
- Operations being funded by Orange County and City of Orlando
- Health Care Center for the Homeless providing transportation and medical services

Osceola County IRC being coordinated by Osceola Emergency Management and anticipates being open this weekend

Seminole County IRC being coordinated by Seminole Emergency
Management and has referral process in place

- Salvation Army opened a tent to facilitate social distancing
- Rescue Mission made single rooms available for isolation prior to other options
- HCCH donating ARNP to staff hotline for providers, assist with medical services at the Isolation Recovery Center and doing screening and referral during outreach
- Christian Service Center partnering with HCCH for screening and referral to testing
- SALT and Osceola Co Sheriff showers
- Coalition for the Homeless, Community Hope Center, Rescue Outreach Mission, Matthew's Hope, Samaritan Resource Center.....

## Needs & Resources

### **Orange County**

- 12,000 masks
- 100 face shields
- 200 N95 masks
- 25 quarts hand sanitizer
- 4000 small bottles of hand sanitizer
- Financial assistance to more than 10 agencies

### Regionally

- 4600 food boxes
- 16 pallets of bulk peanut butter (Salvation Army received and is sharing)
- \$40,000 from Wells Fargo
- \$12,400 from O'Neill Foundation



### CARES Act

- Balance of State Funding through DCF:
- Formula not yet known, but we anticipate additional funds that will likely target Osceola and Seminole Counties and be administered by HSN
