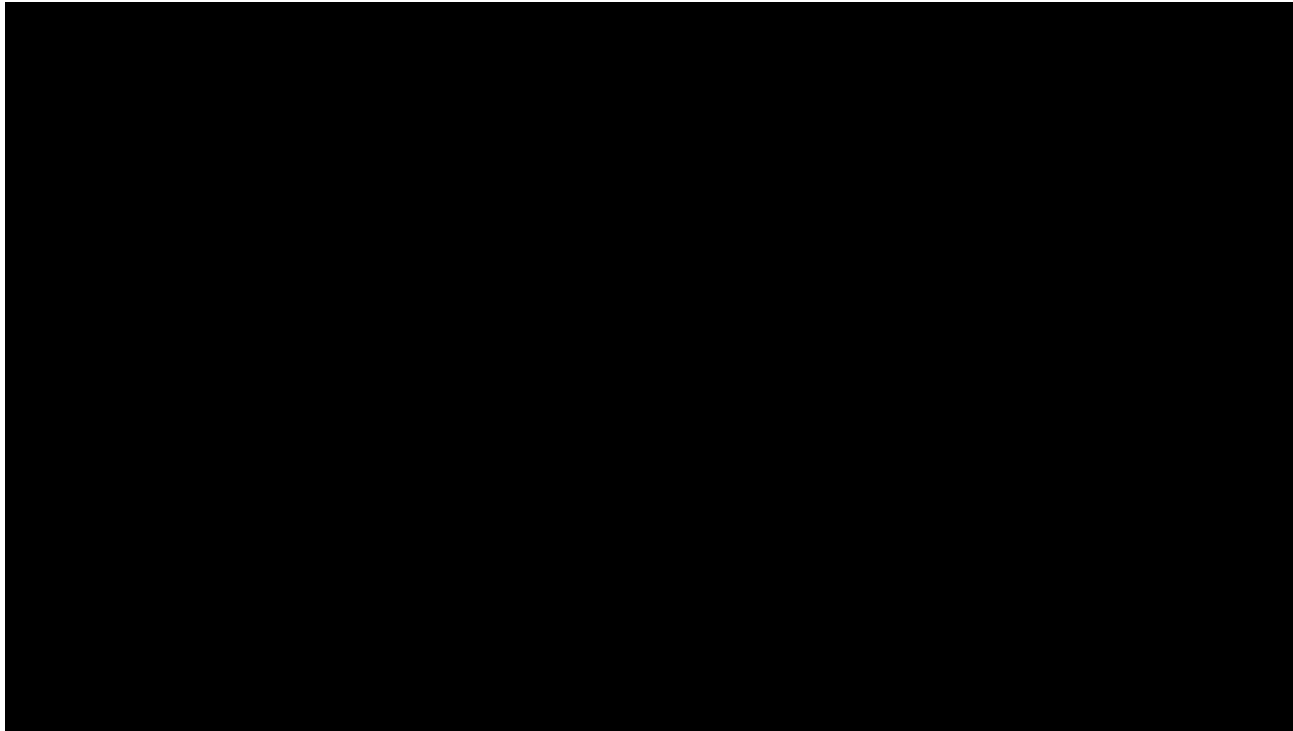

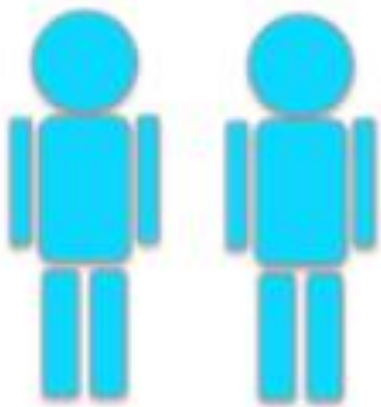

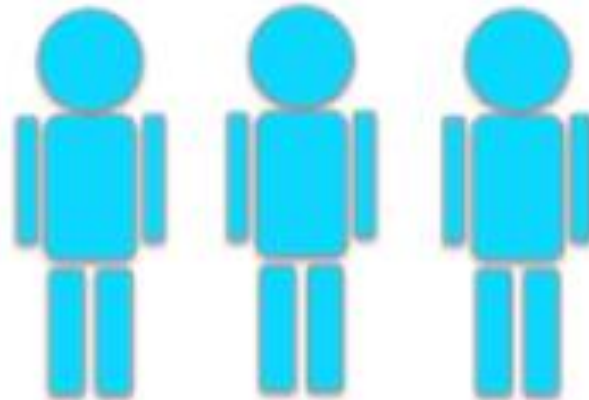


# Functional Zero

Functional Zero is reached when, at any point, the number of people (Vets, Chronic, Families) experiencing sheltered & unsheltered homelessness is less than the monthly housing placement rate for that population.

# We can do it!

- Coordinated work between key agencies, government, PHAs
- Data. Good Data. Transparent Data.
  - Accurate By-Name Lists
  - Data informs on trends, needs and wins
- Strategies informed by Data
  - Moving On model to increase space for new tenants
  - Get creative with already available resources (PHAs and Medicaid funded supports)
  - Advocate for new resources to fill known gaps
- Shift our expectations... and believe we can do it!

# 2019 Year in Review

## RRH Families and Youth

- 209 families and youth moved into permanent housing in 2019
- 235 Accepted Referrals
- 488 Total households served

## PSH Chronic Individuals

- 148 individuals moved into permanent housing in 2019
- 165 Accepted Referrals
- 832 Total individuals served

+

## SSVF\* Veterans

- 325 veterans moved into permanent housing
- 163 veterans housed via housing prevention
- 849 Accepted referrals
- 721 Total households served

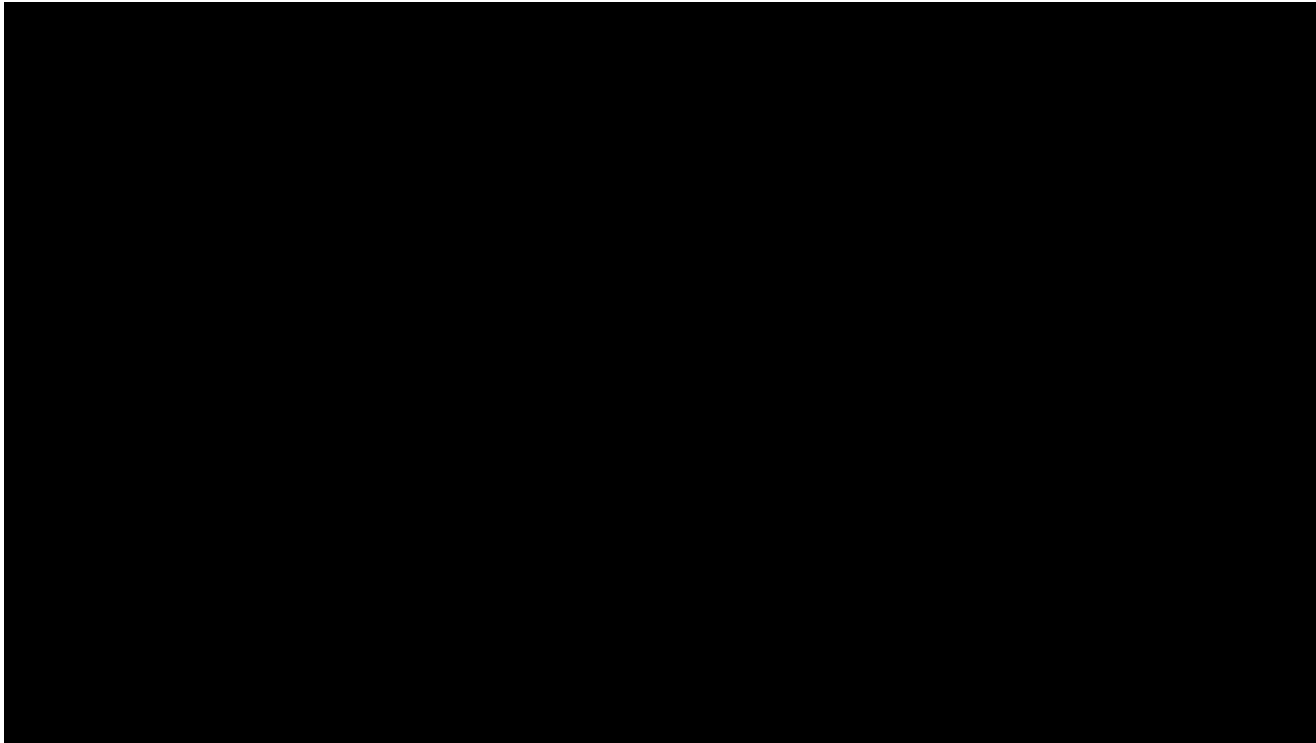
