What is Institutional Discharge?


- ▶ Institutional Discharge:
 - ▶ Is the process beginning on admission
 - ▶ to prepare a person in an institution for return into the community and,
 - ▶ the linkage of the individual to essential community services and supports

How does the existence of a discharge planning policy impact homeless patients?

It prevents those patients currently experiencing homelessness from being discharged back into the streets by linking those persons to essential housing and services

What is the Impact of no discharge planning?

Clients suffer as they experience fragmentation of services, discontinuity of care, and a lack of communication and coordination among various services they may require in the community




Negatively impacts any health gains homeless patients may have experienced while in care



Leads to revolving door phenomenon

What are common concerns?



Preventing the revolving door—
high rates of patient readmission

Relapse of physical conditions

System utility

Benefits of good discharge planning

Healthcare providers can link patients to the appropriate next step resources based on their needs

Likelihood of relapse and return to inpatient care is minimized because of the link or connection to post-discharge services;

HSN's funded activities, highlights



Coordination of expanded diversion, especially with ESL population
Training for agencies and landlords
Landlord recruitment events
Limited incentive/risk mitigation
Support lived experience council
Data analysis

Projects for Sub-recipient Competition

- ▶ Hosting a HUB, expanded days/hour/language
- ▶ Diversion Continuity Specialists - light touch diversion after care (max 3 FTE)
- ▶ Flexible Family Support Specialists (2 FTE) - address bottlenecks in the pipeline (outreach, diversion, navigation or case management)
- ▶ Address barriers for large families, families with pets, single-father families, families with older male children and/or other underserved families
- ▶ Light touch case management (min 1 FTE) for families with permanent vouchers or other “move-on”
- ▶ Connecting families to critical services
 - ▶ Legal, employment, transportation, move in, child care, technical training, mental health services
