

- is the coordination to preparedness, response, recovery and mitigation to any size emergencies, disasters, planned events or catastrophic incidents.

The Office of Emergency Management's (OEMs) mission is to save lives and protect property.





Disaster preparedness

- Preparedness begins with You!
- 3 Steps to Preparedness
 - Make a Plan
 - Build a Kit
 - Get Informed



Make a plan

- Keep your plan simple.
- Keep copies of plan in several places (home, work, kit, etc)
- Practice your emergency plan with family members at least twice a year.
- Plan for pets/service animals.
- **Remember** – Disaster can happen anytime!

Build a disaster kit

- Water – 1 gallon per person per day for 3 –7 days
- Food – for at least 3 – 7 days
- First Aid Kit / Medicines/ Prescriptions
- Special Items – for babies and elderly
- Toiletries
- Flashlight / Batteries
- Battery powered Radio
- NOAA WX Radio
- Cash
- Important Documents
- Pet care Items



Pre-Disaster

Make Direct Connections

- Meet and engage with multiple members of your local Emergency Management
- Attend your Emergency Management's meetings and trainings

Pre-Disaster

Request that Emergency Management convene calls to coordinate services

- Emergency Management can be “neutral ground”
- Allows multiple non-profits to engage the process without one having to be in charge

Pre-Disaster

Advocate for the populations you work with

- Infrastructures and structures get a lot of attention pre and post disaster. You will have to work to keep unhoused person's needs in the conversation
- Volunteer to be a resource for your Emergency Management

Post-Disaster

Know how your organization can and is willing to help

- You have made relationships in Emergency Management, someone is going to reach out
- Being able to provide this information pre-disaster is ideal

Post-Disaster

Provide feedback

- Feedback should be based on your organization's and the client's experiences
- A multi-organization debrief can be beneficial

Post-Disaster

Adjust your pre and post storm procedures

- Ex. Post-Hurricane Ian, Hope Partnership began reviewing all of its emergency/disaster procedures – as a result we are in the process of forming a disaster response team within our staff

HMIS

Data Collection in Emergency Settings



Emergency Settings = situations requiring swift and coordinated response due to potential harm or damage.

Data Emergency Settings = situations where the collection, management, analysis, & utilization of data play a critical role in responding effectively to an emergency.

HMIS data is an invaluable tool in tailoring responses to the unique needs of homeless populations.




Data in emergency settings???

- Assess risks
- Monitor the situation
- Identify vulnerable populations
- Guide evidence-based decision-making to mitigate the impact of emergencies
- Optimize response efforts to include funding these response efforts

A Homeless Management Information System (HMIS) is a longitudinal person-level information about persons who access the homeless service system in a continuum of care.





HOUSE BILL 1577

- **Unaccompanied Youth 16+**

All Unaccompanied Youth certified by the designated district liaison can sign for medical, school related documents, and obtain copies of birth certificate or identification cards.

- Certification card provided by school district
- Certification form provided by DCF, but signed by designated district liaison. Needed for medical, birth certificate, ID.
- FAFSA letter to allow completion of FAFSA without parent information. To be uploaded to FAFSA and shared with colleges.





HOUSE BILL 1577




- **ALL McKinney-Vento Students**

Provided for all McKinney-Vento qualifying students to receive free tuition at any Florida public college or university. This is an exemption, so tuition should never be charged and PELL Grant funds can be utilized for other college needs.

- At this time no age limit (Foster age 28)
- Exemption form provided to high school seniors by designated liaison
- After graduation, form must be completed by transitional shelter director or continuum of care agency, or college financial aid office.
- Dual enrollment in high school is free, and Direct Connect available for qualifying students.

TIPS TO OUR WORK

- We do not provide housing. Our programs are to provide school stability. We are there to help students succeed in school.
- We are here to help students, not the parents or adults. While we may refer, all resources are designated for students.
- School districts do not collect documentation status of students. Only information needed is about housing situation.




